They spend their time preparing and delivering on-air reports, interviewing guests and participate in community activities and promotions.

You like: talking and working with others, you also enjoy current events and news.


Skills: excellent communication skills, great grammar and spelling, and have knowledge of sports, business, politics and other subjects.



SUPPLIES NEEDED:

- Loose leaf and blank paper
- Pencil
- Coloured pencils/markers
- Phone/Computer something to record your podcast









What do you think an Announcer does?

- They prepare and deliver on-air reports, interview guests, and present commentaries.
- They participate in community activities and promotions.

How has radio evolved/changed?

- Radio used to be the most popular mode of communications, radio is still popular, but now there are other ways that announcers share their content including using streaming services.
- Streaming allows audio signals to play live over the internet without having to download audio files.
- One of the most popular ways to listen to an audio show today is through podcasts. A podcast is an audio file that can be downloaded and listened to on a digital device.

Congratulations! You are the new announcer for Career Trek radio. You have been asked to create a demo for a new entertainment report podcast, either about sports, music, books, or something else you LOVE. You must also come up with a way to promote your new podcast.





PODCAST TIPS:

Think about this when writing your podcast demo:

- Speak directly to the listener, like you are having a conversation
- Tell a story, whether it's serious or funny
- Speak visually paint a picture using words and tone of voice
- Include what's new people listen to podcasts to learn about what's happening now
- Come up with at least three different speaking points about your subject
- HAVE FUN!

PROMOTION TIPS:

Think about this when creating your promotion:

- Create a poster/radio ad promoting your brand new podcast.
- Do you want to use a contest/giveaway to promote. What would your prize be?
- What information do you need to include? The podcast name, the host name, what the show is about, etc.



SAMPLE SCRIPT:

Host: Hello and welcome to (name of podcast), Career Trek Radio's entertainment report podcast. I'm your host (your name).

Today we'll be talking about (podcast topic). I can't wait to tell you all about (subject).

To kick things off, I want to tell you about (speaking point #1).

Though when we talk about (subject), we have to mention (speaking point #2).

And although sometimes people think about (subject) differently, you can't forget to talk about (speaking point #3).

SAMPLE SCRIPT:

Host: Hello and welcome to LEGOmania, Career Trek Radio's entertainment report podcast. I'm your host Felix.

Today we'll be talking about LEGO, obviously! I can't wait to tell you all about how this this little toy block became my favourite toy and something all ages can enjoy and create cool things with!

To kick things off, I want to tell you about the origin of the LEGO. Did you know that LEGO is 66-years-old? When I say LEGO, you know exactly what I mean. You're thinking of the red, blue, yellow and green blocks that have little knobs on the top so they fit together. You how it feels when you accidentally step on them - ouch! Pretty much everyone had LEGO in their homes, and if you didn't - you still know what it is. Anyways, 66 years ago, this carpenter named Ole Kirk Christiansen from Denmark, lost his job, and decided to use his leftover wood to make a small wooden duck toy for his children to play with. They loved the toy so much, he decided to turn it into a business... etc.
